General objective: Promote horizontal cooperation among Ministries of Labor of the Region by exchanging knowledge and best practices on public employment systems, from an integral perspective in the delivery of quality services. The Workshop will consider not only labor intermediation strategies but also available tools for employment policies, which are administered based on users' needs in local contexts.

Specific objectives:

- 1. Exchange and analyze experiences on strategies to link Public Employment Services (PES) with the productive environment, as a condition for guaranteeing quality services.
- 2. Analyze the articulation of PES with workforce development (training) systems and with labor market information systems, including Observatories.
- 3. Identify and recognize good practices with respect to linkages between PES and comprehensive systems that address the needs of persons facing greater barriers in entering the labor market.

Methodology: The Workshop will be divided in 3 Panels combining experiences from Ministries of Labor, experts' presentations, as well as spaces for open dialogue. Panels will respond to the "Guiding Questions", which will be sent to participants in advance.
