











The effect of natural disasters and heat stress in the LAC region

A low-carbon economy implies a net job gain for the LAC region, with important challenges to tackle

ILO & IDB (2020) study: a 15 million net job gain in LAC for 2030

- ► Achieving the 2-degree target brings net employment gains of 22,5 million new green jobs.
- ▶ More than half of the new jobs are in the medium-skill category (13.5 million).
- ▶ More than 80 percent of the new jobs created by the decarbonization agenda will be in today's male-dominated sectors.
- ▶ Informality is still a persistent and pervasive condition in the region.

What is a just transition to a low-carbon climate resilient economy?

A Just Transition involves maximising the **social and economic opportunities** of climate and environmental action while minimising and carefully managing any **challenge** – including through effective **social dialogue** and respect for fundamental principles and rights at work and be in accordance with international labour standards. Stakeholder engagement is also important.



Anchoring decent work and just transition in climate action policies

In 2022, 42% of Nationally determined contribution (NDCs) in LAC region referenced just transition



<u>Colombia</u>: Lead by the Ministry of Labour (Law 2169/2021), ILO supported social dialogue in the definition of the Just Transition National Strategy of the Labour Force defined in the NDC.



<u>Jamaica</u>: Implementation of the Green Job Assessment Model in partnership with UNDP; creation of a tripartite technical working group for providing public policy recommendations related to the commitments in climate change and just transition that is expected to support the updating of the NDC.



<u>Costa Rica</u>: Technical support on the roadmap for the formulation of the just transition strategy for the high-level inter-institutional Committee, in compliance with the commitment defined in the NDC.



Enhancing productivity, improving working conditions for workers and enterprises (SMEs)

- Boost productivity and save costs by improving resource efficiency
- Increase competitiveness by accessing new markets
- Enhance product quality through product diversification and innovation
- ► Improve working conditions by reducing workers' exposure to accidents and risks
- Build resilience against natural disasters, price volatility and resource scarcity
- ▶ Pilots in Bolivia and Dominican Republic


